

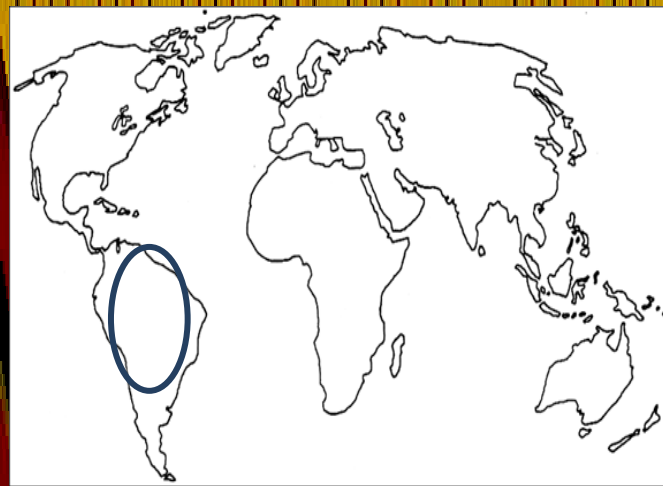
Green-winged Macaw

Ara chloropterus



The Green-winged Macaw has one of the widest distributions of any of the large macaws. Found in Panama, Columbia, Venezuela, the Guianas, Brazil, Paraguay, Peru, Ecuador, Bolivia and Argentina.

Like most other Macaws, the Green-winged Macaw is found in humid Forest, but may also be found in Tropical Forest and Woodlands. Although widely distributed, they are generally uncommon, with pairs frequently solitary and dispersed. They have declined at the edges of their ranges and usually disappear quickly from areas disturbed or inhabited by people.
